As we have not yet received approval from the State to provide breakfast and lunches to our students, we are trying to develop an alternative plan to assist those who need help with providing those meals.

Our food service has identified product that is currently available to make approximately 250 lunches and we have a little more than 1,500 cartons of milk also available. It is our plan to offer these for families as needed. We will have distribution sites set up at the Jesup Soccer complex parking lot, 1115 Duroe St in Jesup and the Hook-an-Liner parking area in Littleton at 11:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. Please send email to mknipp@jesup.k12.ia.us by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 19th if you are wanting the sack lunch for your child and include which location you will pick up at, so we can have the appropriate number with each driver. If you have a need and are unable to get to one of these sites contact us directly and we will make an alternate plan to deliver to you if possible.

Jay's Closet is also working to provide students, families and citizens of Jesup with food and personal hygiene items during the COVID-19 outbreak. These items are provided to anyone in Jesup or Jesup School District at no cost. Jay's Closet will work to gather the needed items for families or individuals and then arrange pickup at the Jesup School Activity Doors or if possible drop off to the person making the request. We are here to help during this difficult time for everyone.
